2024 Report

According to Jim McKinney, who is the Local Coordinator for AARP's Tax-Aide™ program, reported that Lyndon Baptist Church is the largest volume site in the state of Kentucky -

- ◆ 872 tax returns were processed between February 1 and April 13;
- ◆ Refunds totaled \$725,836; and
- ◆ The Earned Income and Child Tax Credits amounted to \$213, 267.

Jim reports that "virtually all of our volunteer return each year," due to "the welcoming environment at the church." The clients also appreciate the "convenient parking, and the comfortable room." He reports that this is not true for most of the sites in Louisville.

In the novel, *The Glad River* by Will Campbell, the main character, Dupes, is being pressured by his mother to be baptized. Dupes steadfastly resists his mother's pleading, saying that he will be baptized when he can find a real Baptist.

If Dupes came to you asking for help in finding a real Baptist, how would you help him? Where would you point him? What is a real Baptist to you? What defines being Baptist? A form of baptism? A worship style? Freedom of conscience? Autonomy of the local church?

A couple of weeks ago, I attended the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of Kentucky's Spring Gathering. The theme was *Why Baptist?* The focus of the two-day meeting was to think about what is unique and valuable about the Baptist witness, not only within the larger Christian community, but the world as well. We sat around tables discussion questions that were given to us. I had some interesting and stimulating conversations with the persons at my tables, as well as between sessions.

So, bear with me as I share with you something that has stuck with me out of those conversations.

The first thing that comes to mind is the moniker itself—Baptist. It is not a name we chose for ourselves. It was given to us by those who opposed us, as a term of derision. Because we insisted that people who were baptized as infants, who had not made their own profession of faith, had not been properly baptized and needed to be, not re-baptized, but baptized for the first time, we became known as "those baptizers."

But, the mode or timing of baptism was not the primary impetus for removing ourselves from the Church of England. The basic question our Baptist forebears were seeking to answer was, *what does it mean to be an authentic community of disciples of Jesus in the world?* Early Baptists were desiring to form communities of disciples who would bear witness to the Kingdom of God. They determined that the commitment to that type of community had to be freely chosen; hence the emphases on freedom of conscience, separation of church and state, believer's baptism, etc.

At the heart of what it means to be Baptist is the desire to present an authentic witness of Jesus Christ through a body of disciples in whom people see Jesus.

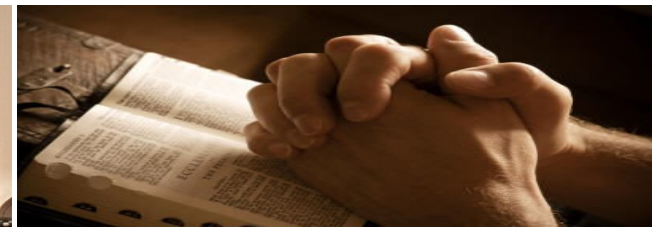
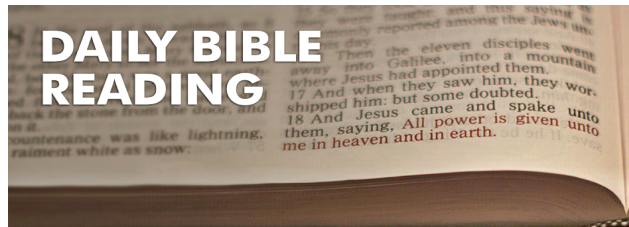
